THE CHAIRMANS REPORT

Since the last Newsletter the Parish Council has been successful in securing funding which will see the Youth Club take children to a Christmas Pantomime. Funding has also been secured which should see a further 12 trips next year together with funding outreach workers costs. Wednesday evenings up to May 2011 will see coaching sessions carried out by qualified coaches in the Youth Club as part of additional activities.

With the increasing numbers at the Youth Club, the Parish Council are to fund an additional worker to fall in line with educational guidelines. The Parish Council were also to fund an additional CCTV camera for the St Helen's Church.

The Parish Council have also made arrangements for Farther Christmas to visit the village in the run up to the big day. Look out for confirmation of when he will visit.

Councillor Richard Baker

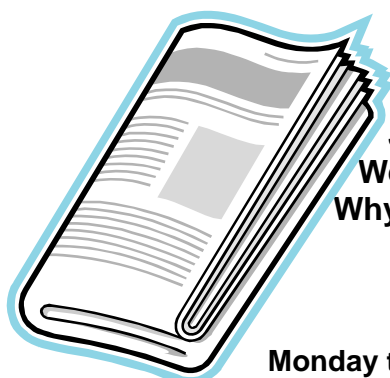

POLICE COMMUNITY SUPPORT OFFICERS REPORT

Over the recent few weeks we have been experiencing problems with youths congregating in the churchyard, allegedly drinking and taking drugs. This has caused problems with some local residents and there has been damage to property. I have discussed this problem with the Parish Council and we are looking into the possibilities of mounting another camera focusing on the trouble spot in the churchyard so that we can monitor any anti-social behaviour.

With this in mind if any youths are recognised or caught in the act of anti-social behaviour then they must face the consequences of being issued with an Anti-Social Behaviour Contract (ABC). An ABC is a voluntary written agreement between a young person, usually aged between 10 and 18, and the local authority and police. Under the ABC the young person agrees not to be involved with certain specified anti-social acts. The terms of the ABC are developed and agreed with the young person in an interview. They then sign the contract in the presence of their parents or guardian, a representative of the local authority and a local police officer. The contract normally lasts for six months. It is not legally binding but, if breached, can be used as evidence if enforcement action needs to be taken through the courts.

So why an ABC?

ABC's aim to ensure that young people who behave anti-socially take responsibility for their actions and behaviour. They are made aware of the impact they can have on peoples lives and warned of the possible consequences to them and their family, should their anti-social behaviour continue. During interviews we may be able to offer diversionary activities through youth clubs, mentoring or counselling. Our aim is to divert young people away from causing problems and towards a better lifestyle.

If a person fails to attend an interview without good reason a second invite will be sent. If this is also ignored, it can be used as evidence should enforcement action be taken. After the contract has been signed the young person is expected to abide by the conditions and complete their contract and this is monitored by the local authority and the police. If the ABC is breached then this may lead to enforcement action, which may include applying to the court for an Anti-Social Behaviour Order (ASBO). For a minor breach a meeting will normally be held with the young person to reiterate the terms of their contract and decide whether any further actions needs to be taken.

Examples of anti-social behaviour that can be tackled by ABC's are as follows – Verbal abuse, harassment of residents or passers by, criminal damage, vandalism, writing graffiti, engaging in threatening behaviour in large groups, racial abuse, drinking alcohol when underage, substance misuse, joyriding, throwing missiles and assault.

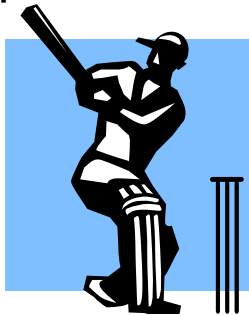
