

TREETON PARISH COUNCIL.

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL ASSEMBLY OF THE PARISH OF TREETON HELD IN THE READING ROOMS, FRONT STREET, TREETON ON MONDAY 27th APRIL 2009 AT 6.30 p.m.

Present.

Councillor J.F. Swift, Chairman of the Parish Council, presided over an attendance of 8 persons, including 4 members of the Parish Council.

Welcome.

The chairman opened the meeting and welcomed those present to the Annual Assembly.

Minutes.

The minutes of the meeting of the Annual Assembly held on Monday 21ST April 2008 were distributed by the clerk and approved as a true record by Councillors D. Whysall and G.E. Payne

Accounts.

The clerk presented a summary of the financial statement for the year ended 31st March 2009. This was accepted by the meeting.

Chairman's Report.

The Chairman reported that the new Washfield Lane Play Area had now been completed. He wished to thank everyone for their efforts in making it a big success, not least the parents. There had been no damage so far only missing plants. The Junior Football team had been issued with two keys for the area to enable them to gain access to the area for kit etc.; Currently the Play Area was closing at 8.00 p.m. and would close at dusk during the winter months. The current closing time for summer was to be reviewed in the near future. It was estimated that currently there were over seventy under 14's playing on the site each day. The current year would see funding for a Cyber Café in the Youth Building. There would be 10 new Computers, Tables, Chairs and lights. There was also to be a new projector and whiteboard. It was hoped that the internet line would be installed the following week and training would be starting shortly. There would be a small charge for using the web. All this was being provided in conjunction with Rotherham MBC. Funding had been received from Rotherham MBC to fund a footpath worker in the current year. The current year saw the funding reduced to £500 but with additional grants of £750 the project would continue for an additional twelve months.

Any Other Business.

Mrs. Robinson enquired about the street signs being covered and people could not see them. It was also noted that the signs on the new estate had letter that were disappearing off the signs. The matter was to be looked into.

Councillor Whysall raised the issue of the War Memorial which was damaged in an accident three weeks previously. It was reported that the driver had been taken away by the police and Rotherham Borough Council had been informed of the incident. They had been and visited the site and made it safe. Councillor Whysall felt that a structural survey of the memorial should be carried out before any repairs were done.
