

Brinsworth History cont...

The presentation of Anglo-Saxon Manors to Norman knights caused hatred among the defeated English. William ordered a survey of his kingdom so he could tax the Manors on a fairer more profitable basis. The famous Domesday Book was completed in 1086, one year before William's death. Brinsworth Manor in the Domesday Book was called Brynesford.

Interesting to note were the name changes in the area, Brynesford in 1086, Brunisford in 1241. Brinsford in 1260.

Brinsworth then led a relatively peaceful era, concentrating on farming until Queen Victoria's reign, when the Industrial Revolution came about along with the railways in 1840.

Because of the proximity to the steelworks and people wanting to move away from the grime of Sheffield to the "fresh air" of Brinsworth, especially after World War II, the population of the village has continued to grow.
